### Have you lost a job through no fault of your own?

You may qualify as a Dislocated Worker and be eligible to receive special funding for training so that you can start a new career. Additionally, On the Job Training (OJT) funding to businesses hiring Dislocated Workers can help you get an inside track to getting that job when employers receive reimbursements for hiring and for providing additional training for qualified job candidates.

Up to \$15,000 in funding available per individual and hundreds of jobs are open for job seekers.

## ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR THE WORKFORCE INNOVATION & OPPORTUNITY ACT (WIOA) ON-THE-JOB TRAINING PROGRAM

Under WIOA, who are Adults and Dislocated Workers?

**Adults** are individuals age 18 and older who are unemployed at time of application OR who are under-employed OR whose family meets adult income guidelines.

**Dislocated Workers**, generally speaking are workers who have lost their job due to no fault of their own and meet one or more of the following categories:

- Is terminated, laid off, or received notice of termination or lay off from employment - and
- Is eligible for or has exhausted unemployment benefits - and
- Is unlikely to return to previous industry or occupation - or
- Returning Veterans are also considered Dislocated Workers

**Currently employed dislocated workers** may be determined eligible for services if the customer's current employment meets the following conditions:

The individual is currently making less than 85% of former wages, and/or is in employment that uses significantly less skills or abilities than the job of dislocation and is not commensurate with the individual's demonstrated level of educational attainment, and the individual's current employment and job of dislocation is not in a field or occupation that is generally known for short term or contract work.
